Final Disbursement

The Compliance Hearing Re: Final Disbursement scheduled for 08/20/2024 is continued to 02/11/2025 at 01:30 PM in Department 21 at Rene C. Davidson Courthouse.

The hearing on final distribution is CONTINUED approximately six months.

The settlement fund was \$50,000.000. The net settlement fund for the class members was \$35,024,927. (Polites Dec. para 9)

There are 50,021 Participating Class Members. (Polites Dec. para 9.) A total of 23,803 settlement checks totaling \$4,307,383.88 remain uncashed after the June 19, 2024 check cashing deadline. (Polites Dec. para 15.) Therefore, approximately 26,218 persons did cash their checks.

Given the amount of money at issue relative to the cost of a second distribution, it makes sense to have a second distribution to get the most money to the most members of the class. A second distribution of the balance of \$4,307,383.88 would result in an average second distribution of \$164 per person for each of the 26,218 persons who cashed their checks on the first distribution. This will result in a significant benefit to the class.

The court in its discretion finds that it is not required or appropriate to make further efforts to send checks to the approximately 26,218 members of the class who did not cash their checks in the first distribution. If those persons did not receive or cash their first checks, then it is reasonable to conclude that those persons will not receive or cash their second checks.

The court ORDERS that the claims administrator must make a second distribution of the remaining funds to the persons who cashed their checks on the first distribution using the same methodology for calculating funds per person as was used in the initial distribution.

The check-cashing period for second distribution will be 90 days from the date the second distribution of settlement checks were issued.

The claims administrator may charge a reasonable amount for the second distribution, which

amount will be taken from the funds remaining from the first distribution.

The claims administrator will continue to hold the 10% of attorneys fees until the distribution to the members of the class is complete.
